



CHILD PROTECTION & SAFEGUARDING POLICY

Alton Trampoline Club is committed to the safeguarding of children and vulnerable adults who participate or volunteer within the club.

We adopt as best practice the British Gymnastics Code of Ethics and Conduct, Health, Safety and Welfare Policy and the Child Protection Policy and Procedures. In addition to which we follow the guidelines as laid down by the National Coaching Foundation, Sport England and NSPCC for Child Protection.

All our coaches have completed enhanced level DBS disclosures to ensure the maximum safety for your child.

Alton Trampoline Club has appointed two Child Protection and Welfare Officers, one of whom should be available at each training session: -

Any concerns, which the child may have during a training session, should be shared with the Child Protection Officer or the Head Coach (Mike Wakely).

Any allegations of abuse or bullying against other members or coaches are taken very seriously and will be treated sensitively and confidentially.

The use of video and photographic equipment can be a valuable aid to coaching. From time to time, we may wish to video your child in order to help them identify areas for improvement and to show them what they do particularly well. In this respect consent is required and the relevant form can be obtained from our Welcome Pack or the Head Coach. You should complete and return the form to the Club as soon as possible.

If you wish to take video, photographs or images of your child during a training session, please first seek permission in advance from the Head Coach who will organise an appropriate opportunity. You may need to sign your camera in at the Sports Centre Reception.
